

Concerned about business sustainability? This week's episode is a refreshingly optimistic conversation with Professor Chris Fleming and Professor Nick Barter, co-authors of the new book, Future Normal: 8 Questions to Create Businesses Your Children Will be Proud Of.

Four years ago, Chris and Nick, both lecturers in Griffith University's MBA program, realised a new paradigm had emerged around core business values - one which they wanted to develop further, and get into the hands of a wider audience. (As Chris points out, not everyone wants to spend a few years of their life and \$50,000 on an MBA...)

The outcome of their collaboration is a book which explores the idea that businesses are the really the tools we use to shape our world, so it follows that they also need to lead the charge in changing our world.

This is not about businesses sacrificing profitability for future generations, but rather, how long-term business value is actually optimised when society thrives. Find out what a 'future normal' business looks like, and how small steps now can set you on the right path for both the planet and your bottom line.

The Australian Government's \$500 million **Housing Support Program (HSP) Stream 1** is now open for applications from state, territory and local governments for projects that will boost the planning required to increase housing supply.

Funding will be provided via two streams:

Stream 1 is designed for projects that will improve planning capacity.

Stream 2 will focus on infrastructure projects that support new housing of this program, by ensuring enabling infrastructure and amenities are in place.

Stream 2 will provide funding for projects that provide enabling infrastructure and amenities such as footpaths, roads, and parks to support new housing. This stream will open for applications May 2024

The program will operate over 2023-24 and 2024-25, concluding on 30 June 2025.

Strategic Review of the Australian Apprenticeship Incentive System

The Australian Government is undertaking a review of the **Australian Apprenticeship Incentive System (Incentive System).** 

The Incentive System provides financial support to apprentices, trainees and employers working in priority industries. It is intended to encourage people to start an apprenticeship or traineeship and see it through to completion. This is to ensure Australia has workers with the trade and technical skills needed by industry, providing a secure, well-paid work and career advancement.

Apprenticeship completion rates have been in steady decline over several years. The review is looking into how support can best be placed to increase the completion rate.
