Operating for an incredible 76 years, the 45-hectare Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary (originally the Currumbin Bird Sanctuary) is one of the Gold Coast's most beloved community assets, and is also a significant regional employer and training centre, with 1000+ workers, volunteers and trainees.

Today's guest Michael Kelly, who until recently was the Sanctuary's General Manager, gives us an insight their world-class conservation projects around the region, the newly launched 'The Homestead' fine dining and event facility (a game changer for the Southern Gold Coast), and a mind-boggling 33 other projects in the works.

We also talk about Michael's new role overseeing all strategic and major projects for the National Trust of Queensland, which includes the Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary.



Michael commenced his career in operational management within the theme park, hotel and casino industries before joining Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary in 2013. During his tenure with Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary, Michael has overseen unprecedented growth in visitation and revenue with his strengths in connecting strategy, visitor experience and business outcomes.

This has allowed the commercial revenue arm of the business to almost double during his tenure. After leading the Sanctuary for seven years, Michael is now the General Manager of Strategic Projects for the National Trust of Queensland, which is headquarted at Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary.

This project is delivering on the Australian Government's <u>Regional Investment Framework</u>, in the focus area of 'Investing in People' (targeted investment in skills, education and local leadership capacity) and 'Investing in Industries & Local Economies' (Supporting the conditions needed for regional industries to diversify and grow).




Transport is currently the third-largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in Australia, amounting to 21 per cent of Australia's greenhouse gas emissions in 2023. If left unchecked, transport emissions are on track to be the largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in Australia by 2030.

All Australians now have an opportunity to share their views on the most effective options for governments, business and the community, to reduce emissions in the transport sector by 2050.

The Australian Government's **Transport and Infrastructure Net Zero Consultation Roadmap** identifies opportunities for productivity benefits and innovation through decarbonising transport and transport infrastructure.

This feedback will guide the development of the actions and policies the Australian Government will commit to in the final Transport and Infrastructure Net Zero Roadmap and Action Plan, which will be released later this year.

Consultation will close on 26 July 2024.





The Australian Government's First Nations Digital Inclusion Advisory Group is seeking feedback on the key considerations that should be included in its long-term roadmap to narrow the digital divide.

This roadmap will outline the path forward towards achieving Target 17 in the National Agreement on Closing the Gap, which aims for equal levels of digital inclusion for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people by 2026, and beyond.

The Advisory Group has released a discussion paper calling for submissions on both the practical actions needed to improve digital inclusion for First Nations people and communities, as well the broader structural changes needed to ensure First Nations people and communities can get the most out of being online and having access to information and services.

Submissions close on Friday 28 June 2024.






